### For newborns up through six years of age

Children seven years old or older should attend children's or youth faith formation classes before receiving Sacrament of Initiation, such as baptism. For more information contact Alma Cervantes at 281-481-6816, EXT. 211

## **Class Registration**

You may register your child for baptism class with the Parish Receptionist in the Education building. (Forms may also be faxed or e-mailed, if desired.) Class registration includes:

- Completing the registration form.
- Providing a ten-dollar materials fee that helps offset class expenses.
  - Unless you have already taken the class within the last three years.
  - O Unless you are taking the class at another parish. (Then we will need a letter from that parish verifying your attendance.)

Registration must be complete by the end of the day two Fridays prior to the class date.

### **Baptism Ceremony Date and Baptism Certificate**

Registration sufficient for taking the class does not fully end the registration process. If possible, please also hand in these other materials when you complete your class registration. These include:

- Providing at least one completed godparent form. While only one godparent is required, if your child will have two, also hand in the other godparent form.
- Providing your child's birth certificate. (You can hand in a copy for us, or we can make a copy from the original).

#### Class

Class is designed with both parents (or legal guardians) and godparents in mind. Please attend the entire class.

As a courtesy to the baptism team, please be on time. If you are unable to attend the session for which you have registered, please let us know. Please mark your calendars: If you miss class, you may take the baptism class at another parish or wait for the next session at St. Luke. At St. Luke, sessions repeat approximately once every two months.

St. Luke honors the classes you have taken for three years.

By attending the classes, the godparents will clearly understand the responsibility to which they are committing themselves.

#### **Lunch on the Day of Class**

Two options for lunch:

• Bring a lunch

• Go out during lunch break or bring food back: eating in class is fine.

## **Scheduling Baptism Date**

Baptism celebrations may be scheduled during certain Masses or in communal baptism services.

Wait a week after the completion of your classwork (or the handing in of the competed godparent forms, whichever comes later) and then set up a date for the baptism with the Parish Receptionist:

All baptism dates will be finalized by the parish to avoid conflicts with the use of the church and the scheduling of the clergy. Please do not make plans prior to securing a date from the Parish Receptionist.

Parents do not have to be married through the Church (or at all) to bring their children for baptisms.

If you are married outside the Church, we do encourage you to consider having your marriage blessed in the Church. This is one good way to begin setting an example for your child of what a Catholic lifestyle looks like.

The process for convalidation (bringing your marriage into the Church) is much the same as marriage preparation. We ask you to visit our parish website and fill out a marriage preparation registration form. Go to the "Sacraments" tab and select Marriage.

# **Registration for Infant Baptism Preparation**

Infant baptism is for children ages 0-6 years of age. (St. Luke has a different program for children/teens seven years of age or older. It is the RCIA for children. For more information on children's RCIA, contact Alma Cervantes at 832-671-0100.)

A person being baptized may have either one or two godparents. If two, then one of them must be a male person and the other a female person.
